FIRST GENERATION

Andre Lamoreaux (Shipmaster)^{1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13} was born in 1660 in Meche, Saintonge, France. Saintonge, a short distance from Bordeaux, is presently known as Meschers, Charente Maritime, France. He died in 1706 in New Rochelle, Westchester, New York.

The Huguenots were a persecuted minority in France during most of the period from early 1500 until 1789. Huguenot was the name given in the time of the Reformation to the French Protestants. The word may come from the German word Eidgenossen, or "confederates," a term once applied to Swiss Protestants. ""

In their struggles for religious freedom, the Huguenots were driven to become a political party and even a "state within a state," headed by some of the greatest French nobles. By the middle of the 16th century, the Huguenots by their numbers and influence had aroused the fears of the Catholic party and the powerful family of Guise.

Eight separate religious wars followed. The first war began with an attack by the Duke of Guise and his followers on a congregation of Huguenots assembled for worship in a barn. A period of peace that followed the third war was broken by 1572 by the massacre of St. Bartholomew's Day, the most dreadful of the many crimes that marked this era of religious and civil warfare.

The Huguenot wars ended in 1598, when Henry IV -- who had been a Huguenot but who had agreed to conform to the Roman Catholic Church -- issued the Edict of Nantes. The edict gave the French Protestants political rights, religious freedom, and the possession of certain fortified towns.

Their fortresses were lost with the capture of La Rochelle in 1628. Although the Edict of Nantes was in other respects confirmed, the Huguenots were still harassed and persecuted from time to time.

When Louis XIV revoked the Edict of Nantes in 1685, all protection of law was withdrawn from the Huguenots. Although they were forbidden to leave France, hundreds of thousands fled. They carried French arts, manufactures, and culture to England, Germany, the Netherlands, and the British colonies of North America.

Among the early fugitives from this act of persecution was *Andre Lamoreaux* [while in France it is most likely that the surname Lamoreaux was spelled Lamoureux], a shipmaster and pilot of the small port of Meche [now Meschers] Province of Saintonge, near the mouth of the Gironde and a short distance below Bordeaux.

Accompanied by his wife, *Suzanne Latour*, and two children, Elizabeth and Jacques, he made his way to Bristol, England, with which port the sturdy shipmasters of the western coast of France had established a thriving trade. The records of the little French church which the fugitives promptly organized in Bristol shows that the colony maintained itself there for many years.

Unlike the larger and better known colony in London, Bristol did not attract to itself the refugees of gentle birth and position, but rather those whose commercial and seafaring occupations had made them acquainted with this part of England. Among these it is permissible to presume that *Andre Lamoureux* was a man of exceptional strength of character and influence. The fact that he was a pilot on the dangerous coast of western France is evidence of the first, and the frequent appearance of his name in the

records of other members of the colony warrants the second conclusion.

Suzanne Latour, his wife, was apparently a woman of the same type, for both at Bristol and in New York her name frequently appears in the records, and she was able to educate her children to some degree in spite of the lack of school opportunities.

The first appearance of *Andre Lamoureux* and wife, *Suzanne Latour*, in the Bristol Church records was on 1689, a little over four years after the Revocation of the Edict of Nantes, the date being December 1, 1690, they buried their son Jacques, who came from France with them; on January 7, 1694, they christened a son Daniel, who was born December 24, 1693, and who appears to have died soon after; on December 1, 1695, they christened another son *Daniel* whose recorded date of birth was November 29, 1695.

The last recorded act of *Andre Lamoreaux* in the French Church of Bristol was dated March 25, 1695, when he signed as a witness to the marriage of two friends, Bedoq-Roy. In anticipation of his emigration to America he took out denization papers on June 22, 1694, for himself and his family.

Early in 1700, or the preceeding year, *Andre* arrived in New York. The first entry in the records of the French Church of New York was dated November 6, 1701, and records the christening of Jean, the son of Daniel Jandain and *Catherine Lamoreaux*, and the last entries were in May 29, 1720, recording the christening of Daniel, son of *Daniel and Jeanne Lamoreaux*, January 4, 1721, the christening of Judith, the daughter of Pierre Chaperon and Judith Lamoreaux, and January 17, 1722, the christening of Andre the second son of *Daniel and Jeanne Lamoreaux*.

According to the Census of New York taken about 1703, Documents of New York, Volume 1, page 620, *Andrew Lamarue (Andre Lamoreaux)* was a resident of the West Ward of that town. There is one more record; on May 4, 1706, Governor Cornbury signed an order discharging *Andrew (Andre) Lamoreaux*, captain of a merchantman from impressment.

He was married to *Suzanne Latour* in [about] 1681 in Meche, Saintonge, France. *Suzanne Latour* was born in 1665 in Saintes, Charente Maritime, France. She died in 1720[?] in New Rochelle, Westchester, New York. *Suzanne Latour Lamoreaux* was living on May 10, 1720. Children of *Andre*

Daniel Lamoreaux was a cordwainer by trade. He moved to New Rochelle between 1724 and 1726. By 1736, he resided in Bedford, and finally in 1739, he was located in the Western part of Westchester County, or the Southern part of Dutchess County. He made his home on the Phillipse Manor.

W.J. Blake in his History of Putnam County says of the settlement of Phillipstown that the first settler in the region of "The Old Highland Church" on the road from Cold Spring to Fishkill, was David Heustis in 1730. The Andersons, the Haight, the Bloomers, the Wilsons and the Lamoreaux followed soon after. The family homestead was at or near a place known locally as Davenport's Corners.

Daniel's family consisted of seven sons and two daughters. His wife, **Jeanne Masse** [also spelled Masee and Massy], died about 1739 or soon after the birth of Joshua, and she is buried at Phillipstown. She was the daughter of **Pierre Masse and Elizabeth Mersereau**. She was presented for baptism on July 5, 1696 by Daniel Lambert and Suzanne Dousinet.

He was married to **Jeanne Masse** on 28 Jun 1719 in New York City, New York. **Jeanne Masse**^{16,14,8,6,17,9} was born on 22 May 1696 in New York City, New York. Aaltje Storms, was the widow of Frederich Bancker, of Philips Burgh, Westchester County, New York, **Daniel Lamoreaux** and Aaltie Storms had no known children.

Isaac Quantain and **Esther Masse** acted as sponsors for the Christening of Andre Lamoureux, January 17, 1722, French Church, New York City, New York. He died on 28 Nov 1809 in Yorktown, Westchester, New York.

13. **Jean Lamoreaux**,^{18,19,12,4} was born on 31 Dec 1723 in New York City, New York.¹⁹ He signed a will on 31 Dec 1808 in Goshen, Orange, New York. He died in 1809 in Monroe Township, Orange, New York.

In the Early History of Putnam County, New York, by W.J. Blake, under Early Settlement of Philipstown and Putnam Valley, mention is made of a first settlement in 1730, and states..."A short time afterward a man by the a name of Lamoreaux settled there."

In the History of Putnam County, New York, by W.S. Pelletreau, 1886, under "Town of Philipstown and Philipse", "Lot number 2 was first surveyed in 1754 and in a survey of 1769 same was in 8 lots. Owner of lot number 8 is given as **Joshua Lamoreaux**. The chapter goes on to say..."The Lamoreaux family were a French family and were settled on the post road still farther north, their tract embracing the northeast corner of the lot."

One reads in The History of Orange County, New York, by Rutenber & Clard: "At an annual town meeting held in the house of John Weygant in Smiths Lower Clove, on first Tuesday in April, 1799, Robert Lamoreaux is one of the eight fence viewers and Peter Lamoreaux, Junior, is one of the Pound,

Masters."

"In a list of 29 path masters, Number 2 is Peter Lamoreaux, Number 21 is Jesse Lamoreaux, Number 24 is Peter Lamoreaux, Junior, Number 26 is Luke Lamoreaux, and Number 27 is Isaac Lamoreaux. Later on, there appears Robert Lamoreaux, fence viewer in 1799, probably lived in the neighborhood of the well-known Lamoreaux family." Lower down..."Jesse Lamoreaux was the father of Robert Lamoreaux of later times and lived in the Dickerman neighborhood."

Again..."Isaac J. Lamoreaux lived a mile east of Turner's." The first road survey recorded was under date of October 15, 1799, as follows: Beginning at the road between the house of Isaac Lamoreaux and the house of widow Prindle, where there are two maple trees marked, and run from thence near a pepperage-tree standing near the line of Lamoreaux and Jones lots." Continuing... "In 1803, it was voted to build pounds at Adam Belchers, Peter Lamoreaux's, Johy Weygant's and Jacob Mandeville's, and twenty-five dollars was appropriated for the building of the four."

During the days before, including and following the American Revolution, the Cloves of Orange County, while inhabited, were remote and very wild. The people of the Cloves seem not to have mingled much with those living in more open country in Orange County.

There was no established church in the area 1783.

After 1783, The Reverend Silas Constant, a Presbyterian minister recorded in his journal the events of his travels and ministry in the area. The journal of Reverend Silas Constant was edited in 1903 by Emily Warren Roebing and published by the Daughters of the American Revolution.

During the American Revolutionary War, the inhabitants were equally divided between the Patriots and the Loyalists. Most of them signed the Association Tests, but not so many joined the Militia, and a number of the later were branded as out and out Tories. After the war ended, those who had vascillated, or gone definitely over to the "enemy" were highly unpopular and many moved to the wilds of Pennsylvania.

Thomas and John Lamoreaux settled on the eastern side of the valley on the slope of the mountains, in Jackson, Luzerne, Pennsylvania, before 1800, and probably before the year 1796."

14. **Pierre Lamoreaux**,^{20,21,22} was born on 3 Sep 1726 in New Rochelle, Westchester, New York. He died on 3 Mar 1821 in Cornwall Precinct, Orange County, New York.

The Daughters of the American Revolution Listing of Patriots states that Peter (Pierre) Lamoreaux was a Private from New York in the American Revolution. He moved from Philipstown, Putnam County, New York, to Orange County, New York, about 1776. His will was dated, 25 March 1816,

Southfield, Orange County, New York; the will was probated March 23 , 1821.

He was married to Phoebe Wood on 30 Oct 1748. **Phoebe Wood** was born on 2 Jun 1725. Children of Pierre Lamoreaux and Phoebe Wood were:

16. **Jacques Lamoreaux**, ^{4,15,23,24,25} was born on 12 Feb 1731 in New Rochelle, Westchester, New York. He was buried in 1821 in Indian Fields Cemetery, Albany County, New York. He died on 1 Mar 1821 in Westerlo, Albany County, New York.

Jacques Lamoreaux moved to Rensselaerville, Albany County, New York at the beginning of the American Revolution. This copy of his will was obtained from the Clerk of Surrogate Records, Albany, New York:

In the name of God, Amen. I, Jacques Lamoreaux, of the town of Rensselaerville, in the County of Albany, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, and being of sound and perfect mind and memory. Blessed be Almighty God, for the same do make and publish this, my last Will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to say)

FIRST: I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Hannah Lamoreaux, the sole use of all my personal and real property during her natural life. I also give and bequeath unto my only daughter, Cathy Lamoreaux Smith, five dollars which is to be paid to her by the executors hereinafter named in one month after my death and the death of Hannah, my wife. I also further give and bequeath the remainder of all my personal and real estate to my seven beloved sons (viz) Daniel Lamoreaux, Aaron Lamoreaux, Peter Lamoreaux, William Lamoreaux, James Lamoreaux, John Lamoreaux and George Lamoreaux, each one, to have an equal share of both personal and real property, the personal property to be divided in one

month after the death of me and my wife. And the shares of such of my said seven sons as do not appear to take the property within one month shall be sold by my said executors and the money paid to them, and in case no agreement shall be made by my seven sons as to the division of my real estate within one year after my death and the death of my wife then it shall be lawful for the executors herein named to sell my real estate and divide the money equally to my said seven sons.

I also appoint Daniel Lamoreaux and Peter Lamoreaux executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former or other wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the ninth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen.

Signed, sealed, published and declared by the above Jacques Lamoreaux to be his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses in the presence of the testator. <James Sackett, Walter Damond, Stephen Thompkins>

He was married to Hannah (unknown). **Hannah (unknown)**²⁴ was born in 1738 in Phillipstown, Putnam County, New York. She died on 11 May 1815 in Westerlo, Albany County, New York. Children of Jacques Lamoreaux and Hannah (unknown) were:

17. **Isaac Lamoreaux**^{26,12} was born on 15 Nov 1732 in New Rochelle, Westchester, New York. He died on 17 Mar 1817 in Pleasant Valley, Dutchess County, New York.

Isaac Lamoreaux settled in Pleasant Valley, <formerly Salt Point> Dutchess County, New York, in 1774. He purchased his farm in 1773 from the British Crown, or as his immediate descendants were fond of saying, from King George. In later years, George Lamoreaux had in his possession the original deed. Isaac executed a deed of the home farm to his son, Timothy, in 1814, giving back to his father a mortgage and bond to secure \$16,500.00. The ancestral home is located at Salt Point, Dutchess County, New York.

Isaac Lamoreaux' grave is well preserved and a monument erected by his son, Timothy, reads: "In memory of Isaac Lamoreaux who died March 13, 1817, aged 84 years." His wife's monument reads: "In memory of Hannah Lamoreaux, wife of Isaac Lamoreaux, who departed this life April 20, 1805, aged 58 years, 10 months, 11 days. "Beneath this monument I lie entombed in silent dust, when Christ shall raise the dead, may I be among the just"

19. **Josue (Joshua) Lamoreaux**^{27,28,29,6,30,31} was born on 9 Jan 1739 in Phillipstown, Putnam County, New York. **Josue (Joshua) Lamoreaux** fought for the British in the American Revolutionary War. In the History of Putnam County, New York, **Josue** is named in the 1776 tax list of Philipse Patent; he is

also listed in 1769 as an owner of property in Philipstown, New York.

When peace was established in 1783, many thousands of Loyalists, who were referred to as Tories by their fellow countrymen, left the newly created United States. They started their lives afresh under the British flag in Nova Scotia and in the unsettled lands above the St. Lawrence rapids and north of Lake Ontario.

This huge influx of settlers, who were known in Canada and England as the United Empire Loyalists, marked the first major wave of immigration by English-speaking settlers since the days of New France. Their arrival had two immediate consequences for the British Colonies. Both the Atlantic province of Nova Scotia and the inland colony of Quebec had to be reorganized.

"The previously unsettled forests to the west of the Bay of Fundy, once part of French Acadia, had been included in Nova Scotia. In 1784 this area was established as a separate colony known as New Brunswick. Cape Breton Island was simultaneously separated from Nova Scotia (a division that was ended in 1820). In all, some 35,000 Loyalists immigrants are believed to have settled in the Maritimes.

Josue (Joshua) Lamoreaux sailed from New York with fellow Loyalists arriving in New Brunswick in 1783. In 1805, Josue (Joshua) Lamoreaux, influenced by Colonel John Graves Simcoe, Lieutenant-Governor of Upper Canada, moved to Scarborough, York County, Upper Canada. The area, now a suburb of Metropolitan Toronto, still bears the name L'Amoreaux.

The Scarborough Historical Society erected a plaque mounted on a memorial stone cairn topped with the original St. Paul's L'Amoreaux copper bell. The bronze plaque reads:

St. Paul's Church, Lamoreaux 1840-1935. In 1808 *Josue L'Amoreaux*, a Loyalist of Huguenot descent

who had fled from New York to New Brunswick at the end of the American Revolutionary War in 1783, settled here in Scarborough on Lot 33, Concession 3.

A log school was built nearby in 1817; and from 1832 to 1840 Anglican church services were held there from time to time by Adam Elliot, a traveling missionary and Master of Upper Canada College, including Charles Dade and Henry Scadding. In 1840 William H. Norris was appointed the first incumbent of the parish of Scarborough and with wardens John Hopper and Paul Sheppard began the building of a small frame church on a site given by Cornelius Ward.

St. Paul's Church was opened by the Right Reverend John Strachan, Bishop of Toronto, on November 18, 1841, and served for 94 years as a place of worship and centre of community life until it was destroyed by fire in 1935.

Presently, the site settled by *Josue L'Amoreaux* is described in yet another historical marker which reads:

St. Paul's Church L'Amoreaux, 1935-1978. After the 1935 fire the congregation met temporarily in nearby Christie's Methodist Church. In 1937 the erection of a new church was begun under the leadership of the Reverend Godfrey S. Scovell and Wardens S. Watson and J. Forbes.

The corner stone was laid on November 11th, by the most Reverend Derwyn T. Owen and the congregation held their first service in the new basement on December 5th. The construction and furnishing of the church was completed in 1940 during the incumbency of the Reverend William E. Kibblewhite, when urban development engulfed adjacent farm land and a large new church and multipurpose centre incorporating senior citizens apartments, Agincourt Social Agencies, and Cana Place was erected on a site west of the old churchyard and was dedicated by the Right Reverend Lewis S. Garnsworthy on November 11, 1978. The 1937 building was then demolished.

The Evening Telegram Newspaper of Toronto, Ontario, Canada. Tuesday, October 25, 1938, carried the following feature story:

Resting Place of Pickering Patriarch...Trees Hide Old Tombstones Which Tells of Pioneer Who Lived For 111 Years. James Lamoreaux, descendant of French Huguenots, fought in 1776 and died in 1869.

Brougham: October 25, 1938 (Staff Special) Old stones toppled over a clump of trees growing through crumbling marble markers, a field falling away toward a road and on the other side of the road meadows sloping gently up to a fringe of wood.

It is an old abandoned graveyard where rest forever many of the pioneers who hewed this country from the forest. Obscured from view by a deep dip in the roadway and flanked on three sides by trees, few know of this pioneer graveyard on the farm of Harry Shklar, just a mile south of Brougham, and a few more miles north of Frenchman's Bay, a Pickering harbor.

"Thomas Major, 1831" says the inscription on one weathered headstone. There is a Joseph Thornton, 1827, a Richard Briggs, 1865: The daughter of Samuel and Mary Major, 1835, and on one stone three names, Margaret, wife of William Simpson, 1846, Sophia Briggs, 5 years. 1853, Daniel Briggs, 1 year. 1853; there is Richard Evins, 1851; C. W. Hubbard, 1859, and Angeliae, wife of C.W.H.

And then one finds a dark grey, badly weathered and broken headstone with the name "James Lamoreaux." Faintly to be seen is the inscription: "Died November 16, 1869, aged 111 years, 3 months."

James Lamoreaux lies beside his wife, Martha Cross Lamoreaux, who died in 1851---and her headstone has a spelling slightly different—Lamoraux, instead of Lamoreaux.

Such longevity startles the imagination. Here lies a man who died at the age 111 years, in the year 1869. Born in 1758! Who was he, and what did he do during those hundred-odd years?

Local tradition has not forgotten him. James Lamoreaux was born in the American Colonies, a grandson of Huguenots, who had been forced to flee France after the revocation of the Edict of Nantes in 1685. War and tales of suffering were not new to him, and when the War of Independence

broke out in 1776, ripping the colony apart, James Lamoreaux threw in his lot with the British, fought for the Crown, and subsequently, was forced to evacuate the American Colonies for Parr Town, New Brunswick, with the British.

According to "Past Years in Pickering," written by Reverend William R. Wood, in 1911 he had become one of the 'pathfinders' of the Pickering District by 1812. The pioneer life of hardship was broken for him

by several trips to Kingston--a three week journey in those days--with loads of grist. The load was taken in a sailing vessel which was built at the mouth of the Rouge River. The history of Pickering fails to name the vessel.

There seems to be no record of his activities in the War of 1812, but "Past Years of Pickering" has an interesting paragraph as to his activities during the Mackenzie Rebellion of 1837.

The times were unsettled --- neighbors were at odds, some favoring the rebellion, and others remaining loyal. Peter Matthews, who with Lount was hanged in 1838 for their part in the rebellion was a Pickering man and had won many of the district to the side of the revolt. As matters were hastening to a crisis, the government sent out parties of soldiers to arrest known revolt sympathizers. Matthews had his own men, and for a time they terrorized the countryside.

On one occasion, a party of Matthew's men visited the home of James Lamoreaux. He was a staunch loyalist, and was deprived of his rifle only after a struggle in which he was overpowered by numbers. No sooner had the party gone, however, than the old man, now nearing 80 years, ran across a field to his son's (Christopher Cross Lamoreaux) home and gave him warning in time to escape to the woods with his rifle, so that it did not fall into the enemy's hands.

So now, it is a dismal November day in the year 1869. Slowly a funeral cortege wends its way through the hardwood forest. The husky bearers stop for rest at the top of the hill, then once again take up their burden for the climb to the top.

Nailed down in the tight pine box is all that is mortal of James Lamoreaux. Patriarch of the district, he had visited the little burying grounds on the original William Robinson farm many times during his long life. Now, worn out by the weight of years, he was to rest at last beside his wife Martha Cross, whom he had buried there over 40 years before.

Today, just 100 yards north of his resting place, a good concession road has taken the place of the path which was there in James Lamoreaux' day. And a mile farther north runs Highway Number Seven, paved and smooth, with swift-flowing traffic---an amazing sight for the eyes of James Lamoreaux, could he but see.

But, instead, he sleeps on in peaceful silence. The present owner of the farm, Mr. Khkar, has repaired the fence, so that even cattle are barred, and the tall hardwood which practically surrounds the burying grounds stands, cathedral-like in its vigil.

The area of Toronto, **John McCord** opened the attic of his large store as an assembly room in which these Mormon Elders could preach.

The Lamoreaux family, eager and attentive, accepted the message of the Elders; they were baptized, among them were **David Burlock Lamoreaux**, and his older brother, Andrew Lamoreaux.

As soon as **John McCord Lamoreaux** could sell out his business, he, with his family, moved to Iowa, City, to be near the Prophet Joseph Smith. Subsequently, they moved to the City of Nauvoo, Illinois, and then with the Mormon Pioneers to Salt Lake City, Utah.

In the evacuation of Nauvoo, Illinois, Brigham Young had expressed regret that the great bell hanging in the Mormon Temple belfry tower, should be left behind. A Methodist minister having his eye on the bell for his own church, removed the bell, unobserved by the Mormon leader. **David** and his brother Andrew knew of the bell's removal, and decided with the help of others to rescue the bell, and bring it with them to their new home in the Rocky Mountains.

Under cover of night, they proceeded to get the bell down from its new tower, hiding it in a boggy marsh until it could be loaded into **David's** wagon before crossing the frozen Mississippi River. The great bell is permanently enshrined in Temple Square, Salt Lake City, Utah.
